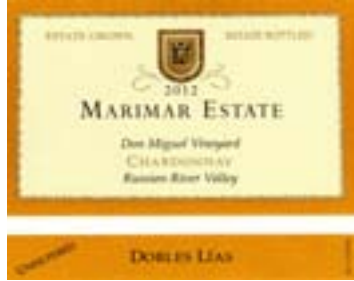
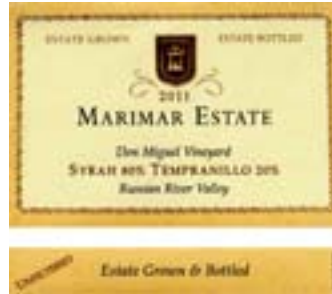

93 2012 Marimar Estate “Dobles Lías” Chardonnay, Russian River Valley, Don Miguel Vineyard. Not much of this wine is made and that’s a shame. A celebration of richness and creaminess on the palate, the wine is given extended lees contact to contribute both texture and complexity. Marked by oaky caramel notes on the nose and palate, the wine also shows minerality and freshness, especially on the finish.

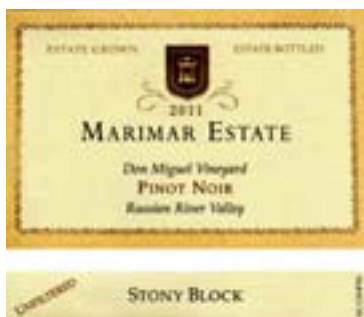
2011 Marimar Estate Syrah 80% Tempranillo 20%, Russian River Valley, Don Miguel Vineyard. Faintly rustic; traces of black pepper and roast game add interest to blueberry and dark cherry notes in this intriguing red blend that displays its cool climate and cool vintage characteristics most stylishly. Handled like a Pinot Noir, the wine has a generous, almost Cru Beaujolais-like mid-palate, and a lovely soft finish for pairing with a wide variety of foods including middle-eastern plates.

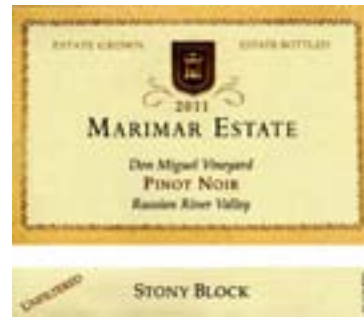
90 2012 Marimar Estate “Earthquake Block” Pinot Noir, Russian River Valley, Don Miguel Vineyard. Smooth and lush with cherry and spice; fresh and balanced with good structure and a long finish.

2011 Marimar Estate “Stony Block” Pinot Noir, Russian River Valley, Don Miguel Vineyard. Still-young and needing time, this wine has cranberry, classic notes of black cherry and a lot of charm that leans heavily on great acidity so the wine works well with many foods. A courageous wine from a cold vintage.

90 2011 Marimar Estate “Stony Block” Pinot Noir, Russian River Valley, Don Miguel Vineyard. Fresh and crisp with racy acidity and lovely cherry and raspberry fruit; balanced and showing a juicy, bright finish.

91 2012 Marimar Estate “Cristina” Pinot Noir, Russian River Valley, Don Miguel Vineyard. Lush and smooth with ripe cherry, raspberry and spice; notes of earth and tangy acidity; long, complex and balanced.
