

2019 "Rosaleda" Rosé of Pinot Noir, Don Miguel Vineyard Estate Grown, Estate Bottled

Why "Rosaleda"?

Rosaleda means 'rose garden' in Spanish, and the name evokes the beautiful color of this rosé as well as the fragrant floral notes of this special vineyard.

The Don Miguel Vineyard

Named after the late patriarch of the Torres family, this sustainable vineyard is located in the Green Valley — the coolest, foggiest region of the Russian River, only ten miles from the Pacific. The European-style high density of over 2,000 vines per acre provides low yields and requires intensive labor; but the vines live longer and the grapes acquire better balance and greater concentration, as well as more elegance and finesse than with the traditional low density.

The Clones

The clone we used for this vintage of *Rosaleda* is 60% Pommard and 40% Dijon 667.

The Vinification

The grapes were harvested September 21, 2019, gently whole-cluster pressed and cold fermented in stainless steel tanks at 55 degrees F. It was bottled in April 2020.

Tasting Notes

Lovely salmon color and attractive aromas of Alpine strawberries in the nose, with floral notes of rose petals and a minerality reminiscent of wet stones. On the palate it is balanced and round, with refreshing acidity that complements its fragrant fruit. Easy to drink and perfect as an apéritif or with foods like tapas, seafood and light dishes. I would recommend serving it at 46-48 F.
